 - Most colleges will use the cumulative GPA from the end of junior year
- Importance of rigorous classes senior year
 - Taking AP classes can help with scholarships
 - Junior Pre-Registration will take place in November
 - Final Registration will take place in January/February

What should you be doing now?

- Junior/Senior Parent Planning Night (September 9 from 6-7:30 pm--EHS)
 - Meet with college reps and military branches
- The College Search Process
 - Naviance--Class link
- Admissions/Military representatives visit EHS
 - Sign up through Naviance one day in advance
- Plan to visit campus of top 2-4 choices
 - Parent must request "College Visit Form Link" from Mrs. Frevert in counseling center before visiting and it will not count against attendance (max of 2 days) (email tfrevert@epsne.org)

PSAT: Friday, October 18 at Elkhorn High School




- ☐ There is a \$35 fee for the PSAT


Fall of Senior Year:

- Begin online college application process
- FAFSA-Free Application for Federal Student Aid
 - Opens Approximately December 1st
 - Education Quest's Financial Aid Webinars (Juniors can watch webinars to plan ahead)

- Begin Scholarship application process
 - Counselors will get you started in August/September
